Principal Update – Dr. Saunders

- Allied Security Guard These guards help with crossing the students in the morning and afternoon, putting out cones, and bust kids coming back on campus from skipping. Having trouble keeping a constant guard and the sub's have been shutting the gates when they are not supposed to be closed. Delivery driver wasn't able to make a delivery, parents were backed onto the main roads during the afternoon carpool because the gates were closed.
- Governor Roy Cooper Visit Cooper toured MHS and met with staff and students on January 30. MHS showed off all that magnet schools can offer students. Cooper visited Agriculture Mechanics class, an IB Literature class and a Food and Nutrition II class.
- AP position has been filled but waiting for WCPSS Board to Approve and Announce the person. The new AP will start March 18, and MHS Admin will be fully staffed!
- Building and Grounds Dr. Saunders would like to get the 100 and 200 buildings powerwashed to
 remove mildew as soon as possible, especially the portions with significant mildew stains. For

 expense, and in collaboration with the Agricultural Sciences Department. Dr. Saunders has asked
 the PTSA Board to establish a carryforward fund to help meet these needs.
